

WALDHÜTTE RULES

For a beneficial coexistence of guests, neighbours and the hosts

Behaviour in the chalet and its surroundings:

- 1. Check-in is flexible by appointment.
- 2. Consideration:

Every visitor must behave considerately in and around the chalet.

Please always wear slippers when entering the living rooms and bedrooms. Smoking is prohibited throughout the chalet. Make sure your cigarette butts are fully extinguished and disposed of properly in the rubbish bin.

3. Damage:

In the event of damage, the hosts must be contacted.

Guests are responsible for any negligent or wilful damage to the chalet or its furnishings. Parents or accompanying persons are responsible for the behaviour of children.

4. Quiet hours:

These include the well-known times, such as all-day quiet on Sundays and public holidays, lunchtime from 1 pm to 3 pm and a night-time from 10 pm to 6 am. Noise disturbances can be a punishable administrative offence.

- 5. No parties or events
- 6. If you wish to have visitors, this must be agreed to in advance with the hosts.
- 7. We ask for your understanding that we do not accept pets due to allergies to animal fur.
- 8. The chalet and its surroundings must be kept clean and tidy. All guests must properly separate and dispose of their refuse to protect the surrounding nature. Messes and soiling should be avoided as far as possible and immediately remedied.
- 9. Open flames are strictly prohibited for safety reasons.
- 10. Risk of forest fires: In extreme drought or strong wind, there is a general ban on fire and grilling in the forest!
